Walter Sauter Funeral Services Held Sat., Oct. 19th

Funeral services for Walter Sauter, 56, Tuttle, a longtime resident, were held at 2 p. m., Saturday, Oct. 19th from the English Lutheran Church there, the Rev. John Holten officiated.

Mr. Sauter died early Wednesday, Oct. 16th at a Bismarck Hospital where he had been a patient since Sept. 19. He had been in ill health two months.

Pallbearers were William Steinke, Ernest Newton, August Beich and Herman Gartner, all of Tuttle; Darrel Christensen, Carrington and Hugh Price, Bismarck.

A son of Mr. and Mrs. E. B. Sauter, he was born Aug. 26 1907 at Arena, receiving his education in Arena and Tuttle. On October 9, 1930 he married Lydia Leno at Tuttle.

After their marriage they lived on a farm southwest of Tuttle until 1934, when they moved into Tuttle. For the past 20 years Mr. Sauter was a bulk station dealer at Tuttle for the Standard Oil Co. He served on the Tuttle school

He served on the Tuttle school board for many years and was active in civic affairs. He was a member of the Tuttle Lions Club and the English Lutheran Church.

Besides his widow, he leaves three sons, Duane, Bismarck; James, Fargo, and Vernon, Denver, Colo.; and one daughter, Patricia at home and three grandchildren.

He also leaves his mother, Mrs. E. B. Sauter, Tuttle; two brothers, Edwin, Tuttle, and Fred, Arena; and seven sisters, Mrs. Earl (Hilda) Hinkle, Jamestown; Mrs. Clifford (Erna) Riskedahl, Tuttle; Mrs. Jack (Viola) Bailey, Bismarck; Miss Louise Sauter and Miss Ruby Sauter, both of Tuttle; Mrs. Arthur (Lenora) Scherbenske, Tuttle, and Mrs. Harold (Mae) Glanville, Wing. He was preceded in death by his father.

Burial was in the Tuttle cemetery, with arrangements made by the Boelter Funeral Home, Bismarck.
