Clifford B. Riskedahl, 57, Tuttle merchant, died at his home on Friday, December 29.

Funeral services were held at 2 p. m., Tuesday, Jan. 2, at the Tuttle English Lutheran Church. The Rev. Chris Stein officiated and burial was made in Tuttle Cemetery.
