Bismarck native becomes a judge

ST. PAUL (AP) — Former Minnesota Human Services Commissioner Sandra Gardebring, one of Gov. Rudy Perpich's closest advisers, was sworn in Wednesday as the newest judge on the Minnesota Court of Appeals.

Gardebring is a Bismarck, N.D.,

native.

"I really hate to lose her," Perpich said at the ceremony in the state Supreme Court chambers. "Whenever I got into hot water, one of the first persons I called was Sandra Gardebring.

"She really has been a trusted and talented adviser," Perpich

said.

Perpich appointed Gardebring to the \$73,811-per-year seat on the 14member court, a new seat created by the 1989 Legislature. The DFL governor has appointed all 14 members of the Appeals Court, which was created in 1983 to relieve the mushrooming case load of the Minnesota Supreme Court.

Other speakers at the ceremony included a cousin, Burleigh County Judge Burt L. Riskedahl of Bismarck, N.D. He read a letter of congratulations from Chief Justice

Gardebring, who was married last week to state Rep. Paul Ogren, DFL-Aitkin, is a native of Bismarck. She graduated from Luther College of Decorah, Iowa, and received her law degree from the University of Minnesota in 1973.
